Mentoring has been in practice in the college for many years now. Every student is a mentee of one teacher of the department to which they both belong. The ratio is about 1 teacher mentor to approximately 27 students. Each department goes according to the needs and requirements of the students. Mentoring cell was formally constituted on 23rd September 2019. The cell organised mentoring sessions and referred mentees to professionals if found necessary. Since the outbreak of pandemic (covid-19) the cell put out requests to all teachers to contact their mentees personally to find out problems faced by the mentees. And the students who came forward with their problems and queries were assisted accordingly. Fourteen students with financial problems were given assistance through contributions made by faculties of the college.
